Adjective / Noun

Meaning	Able to stick fast to a surface or object; a substance used for sticking
Example	The adhesive tape held the pieces together.
Sentence	Use a strong adhesive to fix the broken vase.
Mnemonic	Adhesive = Adhere + Substance
Synonyms	Sticky, Glue
Antonyms	Non-stick, Loose

Verb

Meaning

To make a formal judgment or decision about a problem or dispute

Example

The court adjudicated the matter swiftly.

Sentence

A panel was formed to adjudicate the case fairly.

Mnemonic

Judge = Adjudicate

Synonyms

Judge, Decide, Settle

Antonyms

Hesitate, Defer

Adjunct

/ˈædʒ.ʌŋkt/

Noun

Meaning

A thing added to something else as a supplementary rather than essential part

Example

Online resources are a helpful adjunct to textbooks.

Sentence

The lab manual is an adjunct to the main course materials.

Mnemonic

Adjunct = Add + Function

Supplement, Addition

Antonyms

Core, Essential

Admonish

/əd'mɒn.ɪʃ/

Verb

howdybuzz.com

Meaning	To warn or reprimand someone firmly
Example	The teacher admonished the student for being late.
Sentence	He was admonished for his careless driving.
Mnemonic	Admonish = Add + Warning
Synonyms	Warn, Reprimand, Scold
Antonyms	Praise, Approve

Admonitory

/əd'mɒn.ɪ.tər.i/

Adjective

howdybuzz.com

Meaning Giving or conveying a warning or reprimand

Example Her tone was admonitory during the meeting.

Sentence He received an admonitory letter from the dean.

Mnemonic Admonitory = Admonish in tone

Synonyms Cautionary, Warning

Antonyms Encouraging, Reassuring
