Noun

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**Meaning**

A step-by-step procedure for solving a problem or performing a task

**Example**

Google uses complex algorithms to rank pages.

**Sentence**

The math teacher explained a simple sorting algorithm.

**Mnemonic**

Algorithm = Logical rhythm for solving

**Synonyms**

Procedure, Formula

**Antonyms**

Chaos, Guesswork

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# Alias

***/'eɪ.li.əs/***

Noun

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<b>Meaning</b>	A false or alternative name used to conceal identity
<b>Example</b>	The criminal was known by several aliases.
<b>Sentence</b>	He published under an alias to protect his identity.
<b>Mnemonic</b>	Alias = Also known as
<b>Synonyms</b>	Pseudonym, False name
<b>Antonyms</b>	Real name, Identity

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# Alibi

*/'æɪ.lɪ.baɪ/*

Noun

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<b>Meaning</b>	Proof that someone was elsewhere when a crime was committed
<b>Example</b>	He had a solid alibi for the night of the robbery.
<b>Sentence</b>	The witness confirmed the suspect's alibi.
<b>Mnemonic</b>	Alibi = All I be — elsewhere
<b>Synonyms</b>	Excuse, Defense
<b>Antonyms</b>	Confession, Admission

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# Alien

***/ˈeɪ.li.ən/***

Noun / Adj

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**Meaning** A foreigner; someone from another place or planet

**Example** The film was about alien life on Mars.

**Sentence** She felt like an alien in the new city.

**Mnemonic** Alien = Not aligned — from elsewhere

**Synonyms** Foreigner, Outsider

**Antonyms** Native, Citizen

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# Alienate

***/ˈeɪ.li.ə.neɪt/***

Verb

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<b>Meaning</b>	To make someone feel isolated or hostile
<b>Example</b>	His rude behavior alienated his coworkers.
<b>Sentence</b>	Constant criticism will alienate your friends.
<b>Mnemonic</b>	Alienate = Make someone feel alien
<b>Synonyms</b>	Estrange, Isolate
<b>Antonyms</b>	Befriend, Unite

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
