

# Anodyne

***/ˈæn.ə.daɪn/***

Adjective/Noun

<b>Meaning</b>	Something that soothes or relieves pain; inoffensive
<b>Example</b>	The conversation remained anodyne to avoid conflict.
<b>Sentence</b>	The doctor prescribed an anodyne for her headache.
<b>Mnemonic</b>	Anodyne = No-dying from pain
<b>Synonyms</b>	Soothing, Bland
<b>Antonyms</b>	Harsh, Aggravating

# Anomalous

/ə'nom.ə.ləs/

Adjective

**Meaning**            Deviating from the normal or expected

**Example**            His anomalous test results puzzled the doctors.

**Sentence**           Anomalous behavior was noted in the experiment.

**Mnemonic**           Anomalous = Not normal

**Synonyms**           Irregular, Unusual

**Antonyms**           Normal, Typical

# Anomaly

/ə'nom.ə.li/

Noun

<b>Meaning</b>	Something different from the norm; an irregularity
<b>Example</b>	There was an anomaly in the data collection.
<b>Sentence</b>	Snow in summer is an anomaly.
<b>Mnemonic</b>	Anomaly = A nomad idea
<b>Synonyms</b>	Abnormality, Irregularity
<b>Antonyms</b>	Regularity, Normalcy

# Anonymity

/ˌæn.əˈnɪm.ə.ti/

Noun

<b>Meaning</b>	The condition of being unknown or unnamed
<b>Example</b>	The donor requested complete anonymity.
<b>Sentence</b>	Online anonymity can encourage honesty— or hostility.
<b>Mnemonic</b>	Anonymity = No-name identity
<b>Synonyms</b>	Namelessness, Obscurity
<b>Antonyms</b>	Fame, Recognition



# Anonymous

/ə'non.ɪ.məs/

Adjective

<b>Meaning</b>	Without a known or acknowledged name
<b>Example</b>	The letter was sent by an anonymous source.
<b>Sentence</b>	An anonymous caller reported the incident.
<b>Mnemonic</b>	Anonymous = No-name
<b>Synonyms</b>	Unnamed, Incognito
<b>Antonyms</b>	Known, Identified
