**Antonyms** Urban, Industrial

## Alacrity

Noun

**Meaning** Brisk and cheerful readiness

**Example** She accepted the invitation with alacrity.

**Sentence** He completed the assignment with

surprising alacrity.

**Mnemonic** Alacrity = A-laughing-quickly

**Synonyms** Eagerness, Willingness

**Antonyms** Reluctance, Hesitation

### Albeit

/ɔːlˈbiː.ɪt/

Conjunction

**Meaning** Though; even though; although

**Example** He finally agreed, albeit reluctantly.

**Sentence** The journey was beautiful, albeit long and

tiring.

Mnemonic Albeit = All be it — although it is

**Synonyms** Although, Though

**Antonyms** Because, Therefore

### Albino

/ælˈbaɪ.nəʊ/

Noun

**Meaning** A person or animal with very pale skin, white

hair, and pink eyes due to lack of pigment

**Example** The zoo had a rare albino peacock.

**Sentence** Albino animals are sensitive to sunlight due

to lack of melanin.

**Mnemonic** Albino = All white (appearance)

**Synonyms** Pale-skinned, Pigmentless

**Antonyms** Pigmented, Colored

## Alchemy

/ˈæl.kə.mi/

Noun

**Meaning** A medieval chemical science aiming to

transform metals into gold; a magical

process of transformation

**Example** Turning grief into art is a kind of emotional

alchemy.

**Sentence** Ancient alchemy was the root of modern

chemistry.

**Mnemonic** Alchemy = Magic + Chemistry

**Synonyms** Magic, Transformation

**Antonyms** Reality, Science

## Algorithm

/ˈæl.gə.rɪ.ðəm/

Noun

**Meaning** A step-by-step procedure for solving a

problem or performing a task

**Example** Google uses complex algorithms to rank

pages.

**Sentence** The math teacher explained a simple sorting

algorithm.

**Mnemonic** Algorithm = Logical rhythm for solving

**Synonyms** Procedure, Formula

**Antonyms** Chaos, Guesswork

### Alias

/ˈeɪ.li.əs/

Noun

**Meaning** A false or alternative name used to conceal

identity

**Example** The criminal was known by several aliases.

**Sentence** He published under an alias to protect his

identity.

Mnemonic Alias = Also known as

**Synonyms** Pseudonym, False name

**Antonyms** Real name, Identity

### Alibi

/ˈæl.ɪ.baɪ/

Noun

**Meaning** Proof that someone was elsewhere when a

crime was committed

**Example** He had a solid alibi for the night of the

robbery.

**Sentence** The witness confirmed the suspect's alibi.

**Mnemonic** Alibi = All I be — elsewhere

**Synonyms** Excuse, Defense

**Antonyms** Confession, Admission

### Alien

/'eɪ.li.ən/

Noun / Adj

**Meaning** A foreigner; someone from another place or

planet

**Example** The film was about alien life on Mars.

**Sentence** She felt like an alien in the new city.

**Mnemonic** Alien = Not aligned — from elsewhere

**Synonyms** Foreigner, Outsider

**Antonyms** Native, Citizen

### Alienate

/'eɪ.li.ə.neɪt/

Verb

**Meaning** To make someone feel isolated or hostile

**Example** His rude behavior alienated his coworkers.

**Sentence** Constant criticism will alienate your friends.

**Mnemonic** Alienate = Make someone feel alien

**Synonyms** Estrange, Isolate

**Antonyms** Befriend, Unite

Noun



## Alight

/əˈlaɪt/

Verb / Adjective



**Meaning** (v) To descend and settle; (adj) shining or

illuminated

**Example** The bird alighted on the branch.

**Sentence** Her eyes were alight with excitement.

**Mnemonic** Alight = A light landing softly or glowing

**Synonyms** Land, Settle, Glowing

**Antonyms** Ascend, Dark



# Align

/əˈlaɪn/

Verb



**Meaning** To place in a straight line; to bring into

agreement

**Example** The wheels must be properly aligned.

**Sentence** His goals align with the company's vision.

**Mnemonic** Align = A line in order

**Synonyms** Arrange, Adjust

**Antonyms** Misalign, Disorganize



### Alike

/əˈlaɪk/

Adjective / Adverb



**Meaning** Similar or in the same manner

**Example** The twins look very much alike.

**Sentence** Their ideas are alike in many ways.

**Mnemonic** Alike = A-like = similar

**Synonyms** Similar, Identical

**Antonyms** Different, Dissimilar



#### Aliment

/ˈæl.ɪ.mənt/

Noun



**Meaning** Food; nourishment

**Example** Rice is a common aliment in many cultures.

**Sentence** Good aliment is necessary for maintaining

health.

**Mnemonic** Aliment = Think "aliment = alimentary =

food"

**Synonyms** Food, Nutriment

**Antonyms** Starvation, Famine



## Alimentary

/æl.ɪˈmen.tər.i/

Adjective



**Meaning** Relating to nourishment or food

**Example** The alimentary canal is part of the digestive

system.

**Sentence** Proper alimentary habits are crucial for

health.

**Mnemonic** Alimentary = Related to aliment (food)

**Synonyms** Nutritional, Digestive

Antonyms Non-nutritional, Harmful



## Alimony

/ˈæl.ɪ.mə.ni/

Noun



**Meaning** Court-ordered payment to a spouse after

divorce

**Example** He was required to pay alimony after the

divorce.

**Sentence** The court increased her monthly alimony

payments.

Mnemonic Alimony = "All my money" given after divorce

**Synonyms** Support, Maintenance

**Antonyms** Debt, Neglect



# Allay

/əˈleɪ/

Verb



Meaning To reduce or relieve (fear, worry, or pain)

**Example** The doctor's reassurances allayed her fears.

**Sentence** Efforts were made to allay public anxiety

about the disease.

**Mnemonic** Allay = "Allow to lay down worries"

**Synonyms** Alleviate, Ease

**Antonyms** Aggravate, Intensify



## Allegation

/ˌæl.ɪˈgeɪ.ʃən/

Noun



**Meaning** A claim or assertion that someone has done

something wrong, typically without proof

**Example** He denied the allegations of fraud.

**Sentence** The politician faced serious allegations

during the campaign.

Mnemonic Allegation = A legal accusation

**Synonyms** Accusation, Claim

**Antonyms** Denial, Vindication



# Allege

/əˈledʒ/



**Meaning** To claim or assert that someone has done

something illegal or wrong

**Example** The newspaper alleged corruption among

city officials.

**Sentence** He is alleged to have committed fraud.

**Mnemonic** Allege = "Alleging" before proving

Synonyms Claim, Assert

**Antonyms** Prove, Confirm



## Allegiance

/əˈliː.dʒəns/

Noun



**Meaning** Loyalty or commitment to a group or cause

**Example** Soldiers must swear allegiance to their

country.

**Sentence** Her allegiance to her principles was

unwavering.

**Mnemonic** Allegiance = "Ally + Gents" — loyal men

**Synonyms** Loyalty, Devotion

**Antonyms** Betrayal, Treachery



**Meaning** A story, poem, or picture that reveals a

hidden moral or political meaning

**Example** "Animal Farm" is an allegory of political

events.

**Sentence** The movie is an allegory about human greed

and ambition.

**Mnemonic** Allegory = A "story" with a deeper meaning

**Synonyms** Parable, Fable, Symbolism

**Antonyms** Literal Story



#### Alleviate

/əˈliː.vi.eɪt/



**Meaning** To make suffering, deficiency, or a problem

less severe

**Example** Medicine can alleviate the symptoms of the

flu.

**Sentence** Measures were taken to alleviate poverty in

the city.

**Mnemonic** Alleviate = A level lower pain

**Synonyms** Relieve, Ease

**Antonyms** Aggravate, Worsen



#### Allocate

/ˈæl.ə.keɪt/



**Meaning** To distribute resources or duties for a

specific purpose

**Example** Funds were allocated to improve public

health.

**Sentence** The manager allocated tasks among team

members.

**Mnemonic** Allocate = All + Locate = Assign spots

**Synonyms** Assign, Distribute

**Antonyms** Withhold, Retain



### Allot

/əˈlɒt/



**Meaning** To give or assign as a share or portion

**Example** Each speaker was allotted five minutes.

**Sentence** They allotted a budget for the new project.

**Mnemonic** Allot = A lot divided and shared

**Synonyms** Assign, Distribute

**Antonyms** Keep, Retain



#### Allowance

/əˈlaʊ.əns/

Noun



**Meaning** A set amount of money given regularly or a

permitted amount

**Example** Children receive a weekly allowance from

their parents.

**Sentence** His monthly allowance covers his basic

expenses.

Mnemonic Allowance = Amount you are allowed to

spend

**Synonyms** Stipend, Allocation

**Antonyms** Withholding, Denial



# Alloy

/'æl.ɔɪ/

Noun



**Meaning** A mixture of two or more metals

**Example** Brass is an alloy of copper and zinc.

**Sentence** Scientists created a new alloy stronger than

steel.

**Mnemonic** Alloy = All + Oy! = Mixing metals

**Synonyms** Mixture, Blend

**Antonyms** Pure Metal



### Allude

/əˈluːd/



**Meaning** To suggest or refer to something indirectly

**Example** He alluded to the problem without stating it

directly.

**Sentence** She alluded to her achievements during the

speech.

**Mnemonic** Allude = A lewd hint, not direct

**Synonyms** Hint, Suggest

**Antonyms** Declare, Specify



#### Allure

/əˈlʊər/

Verb/Noun



**Meaning** To attract or tempt; the quality of being

attractive

**Example** The beach town allures tourists every

summer.

**Sentence** The allure of adventure drove him to travel

the world.

**Mnemonic** Allure = All + Lure = Attract like bait

**Synonyms** Attract, Entice

**Antonyms** Repel, Deter



Ally

/ˈæl.aɪ/

Noun/Verb



**Meaning** A person or country that cooperates with

another; to join together

**Example** France was an ally of America during the war.

**Sentence** Smaller businesses allied to compete against

the giant corporations.

**Mnemonic** Ally = A lie together for support

**Synonyms** Partner, Associate

**Antonyms** Enemy, Opponent



#### Aloft

/əˈlɒft/

Adverb



**Meaning** Up in or into the air; overhead

**Example** The flag was flying aloft in the breeze.

**Sentence** The helicopter hovered aloft above the field.

**Mnemonic** Aloft = A lift to the air

**Synonyms** Overhead, Above

**Antonyms** Below, Beneath
